

Grading Policy

 Grades for each marking period are to be determined on the basis of <u>ATTAINMENT, PREPARATION, and</u> <u>PARTICIPATION</u>.

The following weights are to be given to each of the specific elements of grading.
 Assessments (Attainment): 80%
 Preparation: 10%
 Participation: 10%



HOMEWORK!

Homework will be assigned on a regular basis, with the goal being to practice skills and reinforce concepts learned during class.

- Homework will be graded on the following percentage system:
 - 100% for completion or GOOD effort;
 - **75% for partial or AVERAGE effort;**
 - 50% for an ATTEMPT, BUT NOT ENOUGH of the assignment shows that the student made a genuine effort for completion;
 - 0% for NO homework or nearly no homework.

Important to Note: Teachers may assign one (1) homework assignment per week to be graded for accuracy. Teachers must make students aware of which homework assignment will be graded. Grading for the completed work will use the following grading scale: 55-100.

School Arrival **NEW!! MS Entrance**

 Beginning at 7:25am, Junior Aviators should enter the building through the <u>MIDDLE SCHOOL</u> <u>ENTRANCE</u> (Door # 15- Paterson Avenue (near BOE Office/Diagonal Path);
 This is a STUDENT ENTRANCE ONLY! Parents, Guardians, and Visitors MUST use Door # 1 Main Entrance (Boulevard)





(continued...) School Arrival **NEW!! MS Entrance**

- A <u>VISITOR MONITOR</u> is stationed at this entrance to greet our Junior Aviators;
- Students must be in Period 1 class by <u>7:55am.</u>
- IMPORTANT: Any student that arrives at school after 9:00am MUST USE Door # 1 Main Entrance





Dismissal After School

Upon dismissal from school, students are to:

- Report to a supervised activity;
- Report to public library or residence;
 Obey all traffic signs;
- Students will not be allowed to wait unsupervised in the school building;

 Interior Gates will be used after school to deter movement throughout the building during off-hours;

**To ensure school safety at Hasbrouck Heights MS/HS, it is important that these rules are followed by ALL students. **

BACKPACKS!

- Students are NOT permitted to carry their backpacks during the school day.
 - May bring backpack to school, but must be kept in their school locker
- Drawstring bag (supply list) may be used to transport items throughout the day;
- At the end of school day, students may use backpack to transport belongings home
- 6th Grade Teachers will outline plan for students during first two weeks of school.... DO NOT WORRY!

Tardiness to School!

- >1-3 Tardies \rightarrow Excused


- >4th Tardy → Central Detention
- >7th Tardy -> Two (2) Central Detenions
- >>13th Tardy → Saturday Detention + Action Plan
- >15th Tardy → Loss of Credit



Student Dress Code!

- Student attire shall be neat and clean. Clothing shall cover the torso and legs to mid-thigh.
- Clothing shall not be transparent, distracting, or disruptive to the school environment.
- Tank tops, halters, tube tops, and bathing suits are not permitted.
- Sweatshirts, warm-up and T-shirts are permitted, if they are not torn and if they are not cut, tied or hemmed to expose the midriff. No exposure of undergarments or buttocks.
- ► Footwear is required; flip-flops are not permitted.
- Except for religious and/or cultural purposes, head coverings may not be worn in school (hats, bandanas, headbands).
- Students attending any school function will NOT be permitted to participate unless they are dressed in accordance with BOE policy.

What Qualifies a Child for 504?

Students may qualify for services under Section
 504 if they have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits a major life activity


≻Examples:

- Physical: difficulty walking, breathing, eating, standing, bending, lifting, sleeping
- Sensory: vision, hearing, speech difficulties, processing/understanding communication
- Cognitive: difficulty reading, learning, thinking, or concentrating

Intervention & Referral Services (I&RS)

<u>Pursuant to DOE regulations, district</u> <u>Boards of Education are required to:</u>

•"....establish and implement a coordinated system in each school building for the planning and delivery of intervention and referral services that are designed to assist students who are experiencing learning, behavior, or health difficulties..." [N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.1(a)]"





Medication In School!

Policy #5330 Administration of Medication
 Students are <u>NOT</u> permitted to carry medication in school without written consent.

A student who needs to carry medication during school hours <u>must</u> have a <u>written note</u> on file with the <u>school nurse</u>, signed by the prescribing physician, as well as the parent or guardian.

What is the exact definition of HIB?

Harassment, intimidation or bullying means any gesture, any written, verbal or physical act, or any electronic communication, whether it be a single incident or a series of incidents, that is reasonably perceived as being motivated either by any actual or perceived characteristic, such as race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, or a mental, physical or sensory [handicap] disability, or by any other distinguishing characteristic, that takes place on school property, at any school-sponsored function [or], on a school bus, or off school grounds as provided for in section 16 of P.L.2010, CHAPTER 122, that substantially disrupts or interferes with the orderly operation of the school or the rights of other students <u>AND THAT:</u>

▶a) a reasonable person should know, under the circumstances, will have the effect of physically or emotionally harming a student or damaging the student's property, or placing a student in reasonable fear of physical or emotional harm to his person or damage to his property; [or] b) has the effect of insulting or demeaning any student or group of students [in such a way as to cause substantial disruption in, or substantial interference with, the orderly operation of the school]; or c) creates a hostile educational environment for the student by interfering with a student's education or by severely or pervasively causing physical or emotional harm to the student.



What to do if you believe HIB is occurring?

Contact your child's Guidance Counselor, Teacher, Child Study Team member, Vice Principal or Principal via telephone or email to report any potential acts of HIB.



HIB Investigation Timeline

1. Verbal Report – School staff members are required to make a verbal report on the same day the HIB is observed or information is received. The principal takes appropriate action to protect students and implement the BOE's HIB policies and procedures.

2. Parent Notification – The principal informs parents of accused HIB offenders and targets. Parents are called the same day of the incident being verbally reported.

3. Written Report – The staff member making the verbal report submits a written report within two (2) school days of the verbal report.

4. Investigation - is initiated by the principal or school designee within one school day of the verbal report of the incident. The investigation is conducted and completed by the Anti-Bullying Specialist assigned to the case in coordination with the principal or the vice principal.

5. A written investigation – is report is completed within ten school days of the written report. Principal or school designee will inform parents/ guardians

6. Investigation must be given to the Superintendent within two days of completion.

7. Results must be provided to the School Board by the time of the next Board meeting.

8. Letter- Within five days of the Board of Education meeting, the parents are sent a letter regarding the outcome of the investigation.

9. Parents can request a hearing in Executive Session after receiving all information. Hearing must be held within ten days of the request.



HIB Remediation



 Regardless of the result of the investigation, both the accused and the victim will be provided with counseling session(s) with a Child Study Team member, a Guidance Counselor, or the Student Assistant Counselor

 We understand that even though all of the "checkpoints" may not have been fulfilled to label the interaction as a HIB, the conflict may have been traumatic and have lingering effects on the students comfort at school

Conflict vs. HIB

Conflict	HIB			
Equal power or friends	Imbalance of power, not friends			
Can be fairly resolved by compromise and mediation	A fair resolution involves a change in the behavior of the bully; the target has no concession to make			
Involves people with similar degrees of power	Involves a person or persons exerting their needs or interests			
Equal emotional reaction	Strong emotional reaction from victim and little or not emotional reaction from bully			
Efforts to solve the problem	No effort to solve the problem			
Both parties are responsible for wrongdoing	Bully is responsible for wrongdoing			
Is reciprocal; both parties contribute to the conflict	Is one-sided; one party instigates the target
