- Paul Revere was from Boston. During the Revolutionary War, he found out the British were coming to attack the colonists. He set off on his horse for Lexington. All the way there, he <u>roused</u> the people from their sleep. He cried, "The British are coming!"
- When the king's soldiers arrived, Captain Parker and his men were ready for them. Captain Parker said, "Don't <u>fire</u> unless you are fired on. But if they want a war, let it begin here." The fighting began in Lexington on April 19th, 1775. When the British left the town, seven Americans were dead. At Concord, there was more fighting. On the way back to Boston, a large number of British soldiers were killed.
- 3 On June 17th, 1775, a battle was fought on Bunker Hill. General Gage thought the men wouldn't fight, but they did. They fought hard. At last, their gun powder ran out and the soldiers stopped fighting. Over a thousand British men were killed. The contest at Bunker Hill was the first large battle of the war. The war ended the British power in America. The war made us <u>free</u>.
